NOTES OF THE MEETING 10.02.2015:

President Paul Elliot opened the meeting at 19.45 hours and welcomed 20 people to the meeting including 2 guests and 3 members of **Woking Philatelic Society** who were to provide the displays;



Michael Lockton's display was of **Great Britain Airmails**. Post Office labels were used on stamps from the 1860's including Air Mail Labels. The variety of labels used during the 20th century were shown on cover. Since 1927 the label read 'Par Avion' as this was the UPU regulations. Michael showed examples of crash mail, monthly newsletter produced by the Post Office and blocks of labels.



David Stotter presented 4 frames of **postcards** from **Morocco**. The first frame was concerned with the history of Morocco in the early 20th century. This was followed by two frames of German prisoners of war in Morocco during World War I. The final frame was examples of mail from the camps.



Ron Trevelyan showed 4 frames of **Nyasaland and Malawi**. The first frame was a potted history of the country which was then expanded in the next 3 frames. The display included stamps, postal stationery, registered envelopes and postcards.



President Paul Elliot thanked all 3 exhibitors for their interesting material which was viewed by members. The meeting closed at 21.45 hours.
