NOTES OF THE MEETING HELD 10<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2019:**

The meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> September 2019 was a **Member's Meeting** at which members produced material with the **Letter 'C'**. **Graham Harker**, President, welcomed the 11 members present and opened the meeting at 19.40 hours

**Dave Meaney** showed some material of **celebrations** including the **centenary** of the Penny Black in 1940.

**Pauline MacBroom** chose to show **collectibles** and **curios**. These included a variety of material such as **copper coins**, **cigarette cards**, a **china-man candle** snuffer, a marriage **certificate** of her grandparents and a variety of **cats**.

**David Rennie** displayed a number of **coin covers** of modern Great Britain events.

**Graham Harker** chose **controls**, **cylinder numbers** and **control blocks**. These included definitive stamps of Edward VII, definitive stamps of George V, **castles** of 1992-5, and Machin blocks of Queen Elizabeth II.

**John Schofield's** display was of **correspondence** and **circulars** including letters from the reign of Louis XIII and Louis XIV in France.

**John Ray** showed a variety of material from Fiji showing **ensorship** and **concessionary** mail.

**Chris Board** showed Transvaal stamps with **coils** including on **cover**.

**Michael Harris** displayed stamps of the **Channel Islands** particularly from 1940-44 with examples of bisects on **cover**.

**Paul Percival** displayed stamps of **Cambodia, Cameroons** and **Canada**. He also showed a postcard of Oliver **Cromwell** and two postcards of **Croydon**.

**Frank Simpson** showed **cancel**s of Brunswick and Hanover.

**David Milsted** produced material of the **Coronation** of Edward VII including invitations to the event and a programme of the proceedings.

President Graham thanked members for bringing such a variety of interesting material to enliven the evening. The meeting closed at 21.45 hours.
